


CYBERBULLYING



OTHER CRIMINAL ELECTRONIC AREAS OF CONCERN

- Sexting: The act of sending sexually explicit messages and/or nude or semi-nude photos electronically
- Video Voyeurism: It's a crime in Florida to use a cell phone or video recording device anywhere there is the expectation of privacy (i.e., locker-room, restroom), even if the person is clothed
- Digital dating abuse: Nationally 28% of dating students (12-17) experienced digital dating abuse
- Sextortion: When someone threatens to distribute private and sensitive material if one doesn't provide images of a sexual nature, sexual favors, or money

- Anti-Bullying Policy 5.9: All students, staff, and parents are trained at the beginning of the year on cyberbullying
- Investigative Designees: Each school has a schoolbased Investigative Designee trained annually on how to investigate cyberbullying complaints
- Prevention Liaisons: Each school has a school-based Prevention Liaison trained annually on and provided resources for the 6 strands of prevention, including cyberbullying

BCPS CLIMATE SURVEY


- An annual survey enacted in January 2022 to drill data down to the school level so it can be:

RATIONALE: Dating Matters is an evidence-based teen dating viol teaching students healthy relationship skills before they start the behaviors that increase the risk for dating violence. Eke neg strategies, substance abuse, and sexual risk-taking. Data collecte reveal that middle school-age students are dating (52% of respondent respondents are in 7% grade and 76% of respondents are in 6% grade than 6 out of 10 have experienced some form of dating violence.

Students who received the Safe Dates curriculum were 56-92% less & violence perpetration or violimitation than students who aidn't schools who taught Daring Watters to students in \$* and 7* grade, h These students were less likely to be perpetrators of dating violence, vi or users of negative conflict resolution strategies (e.g., explodin control) with a dating partner or a friend. 





- The Electronic Misconduct (EM) data is from the District's discipline codes for sexting (SX) and misuse of Electronic Devices (ED), the Four Tier 3 schools with the highest rates of EM were offered targeted with intensive interventions
- The Acts Against Persons (AAP) data (fighting, bullying/cyberbullying, harassment, threat, etc.)
 identified the four schools with the highest rates and they were offered intensive Tier 3 services
