Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design (CPTED) is a proactive crime fighting technique in which the proper design and effective use of the built environment can lead to a reduction in the fear of and incidents of crime and an improvement in quality of life. It is very important to realize CPTED principals reduce the opportunity for crime; however crime prevention / social programs should be implemented to tackle the underlying cause of crime. These steps work in conjunction to create a safe environment to work live or play.

Access control means controlling access to the site. People are physically guided through a space by the strategic design. Properly located entrances, exits, fencing, landscaping and lighting can direct both foot and motor vehicle traffic in ways that discourage crime.

Generally, criminals do not want to be seen. Placing physical features, activities and people in ways that minimize the ability to see what is going on discourages crime. Landscaping and lighting are two methods used to provide natural surveillance.

The three types of surveillance are:

- 1. Natural The placement of physical features, activities, and people in a way that maximizes visibility
- 2. Organized Security, Neighborhood Watch, Patrols, etc
- 3. **Mechanical -** Alarms, Cameras, Fences, etc

Territorial Reinforcement or Behavior refers to people's sense of ownership. In CPTED it refers to the development of areas or places where the users feel a strong sense of ownership. It is an umbrella concept embodying all Natural Surveillance, and Access Control principles.

The use of physical attributes that express ownership such as fencing, signage, pavement treatments, and landscaping are examples of Territorial Reinforcement.

### Visibility:

- Lighting helps an individual observe their surroundings and respond to a potential threat.
- Pathways or pedestrian connectors must be illuminated to the point where faces of pedestrians can be observed
- Poor lighting, whether too bright or not bright enough can diminish safety.
- The quality of the lighting is as important as the amount of lighting.
