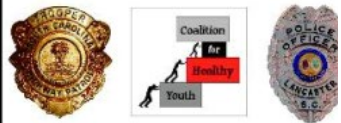

Coalition partners with law enforcement to curb DUI, underage drinking in county

Lancaster County Coalition for Healthy Youth

In an effort to reduce the number of alcohol-related traffic accidents here, local law enforcement has teamed up with the Coalition for Healthy Youth and nationally recognized prevention specialist Dr. Harold Holder to address drinking and driving and underage drinking in Lancaster County.

The partnership's goal is to significantly reduce underage drinking and driving thus by increased law enforcement visibility.

Since June 2012, DUI crashes have steadily decreased by 22 percent in Lancaster County and the partnership's aim is to continue this trend.

students and their parents need to know that law enforcement will be patrolling throughout Lancaster County.

In South Carolina, it is illegal to drink under the age of 21.

Also, it is illegal to provide alcohol to minors.

More than 40 percent of Lancaster County youth 17 to 21 have reported

using alcohol within the past 30 days.

In addition to heightened safety checkpoints funded through this initiative the Lancaster County Sheriff's Office and Lancaster Police Department have announced a partnership

that will increase law enforcement visibility in the county and encourage responsible drinking.

As a checkpoint initiative, the Sheriff's Office and the Police Department will be patrolling throughout Lancaster County.

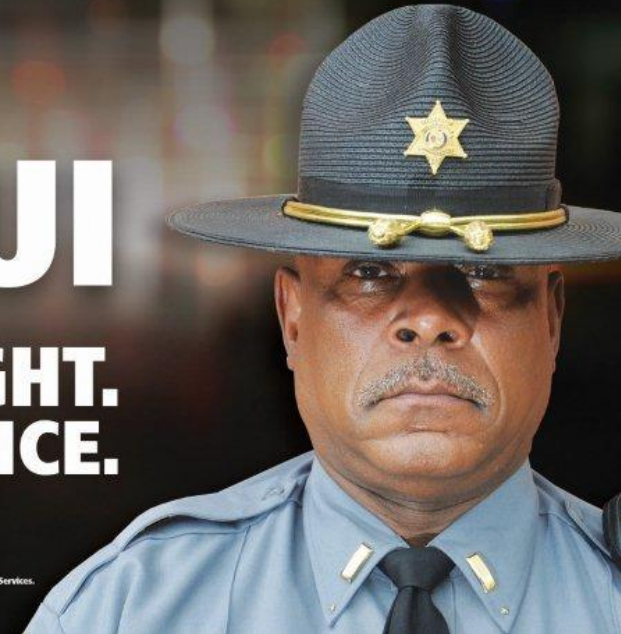
A total of 10 checkpoints will be set up throughout the county.
